Rules reminder from President Ruthie Pallow

Provisional Ball (Rule 18.3)

Playing Provisional Ball until it becomes the ball in play or is abandoned:

Can play provisional up to a point equal to where original is estimated to be (in other words, can play multiple shots until this point)

Ball becomes in play when either of these two happen:

- 1. When it becomes known or virtually certain original is OB or is not found within the 3-minute limit of searching.
- 2. When the provisional ball is played from a point nearer the hole than where the original ball is estimated to be.

Before the stroke is made, the player MUST announce that they are playing a provisional ball.





