
Remember: Life is too short for negative drama and petty things.




Who is Joyce and what did she do? We'll never know. Thanks **Helga Kessler** for the photo!



Gayle Vannes, Linda Nelson and Ruth Pallow taking a break on the golf course. It's a tough life.




Linda Nelson enjoying the Birds of Australia at the Living Desert in Palm Desert. She loves bird and birdies too!
